No further development rights should be granted.
CH/2009/1862/HB	25-Feb-10	The Hit or Miss, Village Road, Penn Street	Demolition of existing side/rear projection and erection of replacement single storey extension, incorporating insertion of new window	No comment

CH/2010/0041/FA	18-Feb-10	28 Mynchen Road, Knotty Green	Single storey side, front and rear extensions, and first floor/roof extension	No comment
CH/2010/0088/FA	25-Feb-10	Hillfoot Cottage, The Hill, Winchmore Hill	Two storey side and rear extensions and widening of existing vehicular access.	no comment
CH/2010/0077/FA	17-Feb-10	Beauchamp Cottage, 85 Hazlemere Road, Penn	Demolition of existing dwelling and erection of two detached dwellinghouses with associated hardstanding and vehicular accesses	Objection. This is still over-development with plot width significantly narrower than their neighbours. A shared single access would allow more of the hedge to be retained.
